The Most Ancient Church

Teacher Background

The Most Ancient Church comprised the first human beings to know and worship the Lord. They loved the Lord and let Him lead them to happiness and did not struggle with selfish feelings. They spoke to the Lord and angels and did not need a written Word. They saw the Lord everywhere and recognized Him in all creation. The Most Ancient Church existed in the Fertile Crescent, where food grew in abundance. People lived in tribes, households and families. Marriage was the chief source of their joy. They knew nothing of controlling others and had no government. However, people gradually closed their minds to the Lord and the Church slowly came to an end. The Word pictures its ending in the story of Noah’s “flood” .

Focus Points

- In Most Ancient times people knew and loved the Lord and saw Him in all created things.
- They did not have a written Word but spoke to the Lord and angels.
- They lived in tribes and families, and loved marriage.

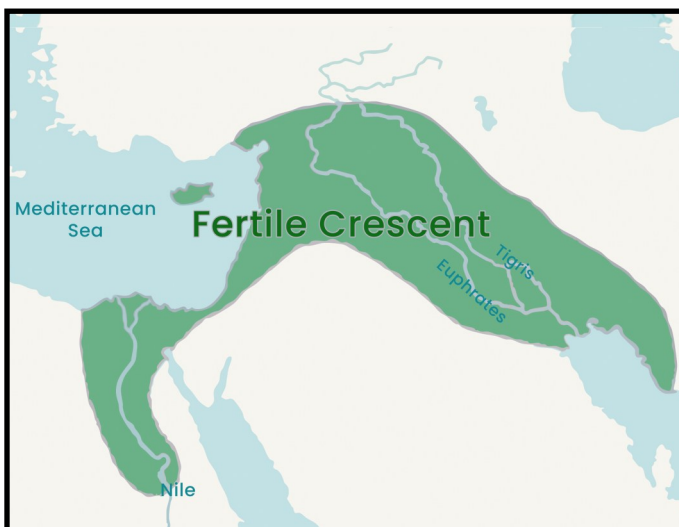
Introduction

From ancient times many people have thought the earliest period of human history was a “Golden Age”, a time when everyone was happy, knew no evil and lived in harmony. The Writings say these ancient people were the first human beings to know and worship the Lord. They formed the first church on earth, the Most Ancient Church. The creation story in Genesis tells about the development of people to the point where they could be called a church. The church was called “Adam”. The Garden of Eden pictures the happy and beautiful life which the people of this church had. Today, the area where they lived is called the “Fertile Crescent”. It stretches from the Tigris and Euphrates rivers to the coast of the Mediterranean Sea in the west and the Nile River in the south. This area had plenty of water for cultivating fruits and vegetables.

Relationship with the Lord

Above all else, the people of the Most Ancient Church loved the Lord. They were wise and heavenly because they believed what the Lord told them and let Him lead them to happiness. They always trusted the Lord, and never worried about what might happen next because they knew He would take care of them. Due to this, the symbol of the Most Ancient Church is gold.

The most ancients saw and felt the Lord everywhere. They could see Him in the beauty and order of nature—in the sun, moon and stars, in plants and in mountains. They called this the “science of correspondences”. Correspondences let them intuitively connect everything in nature with the spiritual idea it represented. They also recognized the Lord in each other. For instance, if someone did something good, they knew that the Lord had really done it, since all good comes from Him.



The Most Ancients and the Word

The people of the Most Ancient Church did not need a written Word to tell them

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who the Lord was, and what He wanted them to do. To begin with, they learned from their parents. Later, the Lord taught them through dreams and visions. They also spoke with angels, just as you talk to your friends. Whenever they thought about what they knew or experienced, the Lord gave them a special perception about whether or not it was good or true. Therefore, the Word was “written on their hearts.”

What Were the Most Ancients Like?

We do not know what the most ancients looked like, but when Emanuel Swedenborg saw them in the spiritual world they looked similar to the people of today. However, some things about them were quite different. For example, Swedenborg hardly noticed their breathing because they had an internal way of breathing. Due to this, they hardly ever spoke but had an inner perception of other people’s thoughts. To communicate, they changed their facial expression by moving their lips and their eyes. So they could speak their mind through their face. Swedenborg noted that their faces were always “honest”. In other words, they could not pretend to be something that they were not or say anything that disagreed with their thoughts.

Another difference is that the most ancient people were born wanting to be good. They did not struggle with selfish feelings but loved the Lord and the neighbor more than themselves! Of course, they had to grow up and choose to follow the Lord, but this was easy for them to do.

Worship

Worship is really a matter of how you live, and since the most ancients thought about the Lord at every moment of their lives, they were constantly worshiping Him. However, they also received instruction and took steps to show their love and respect for the Lord. For example, they showed their humility by prostrating themselves before Him in prayer. They also chose to worship in their tents or on mountains heights symbolizing the Lord. They sometimes faced the rising sun as they worshiped because the Lord is the Sun of heaven. In addition, fathers took steps to teach their families religious principles.

How Did the Most Ancients Live?

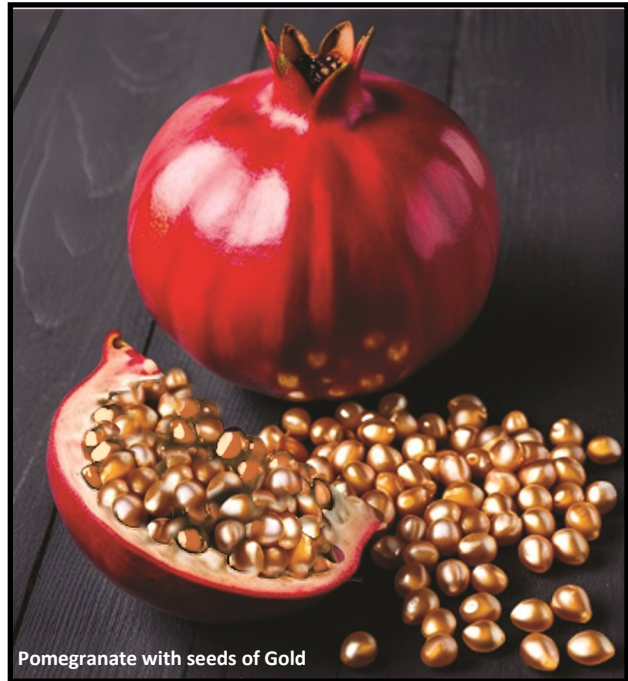


These most ancient people lived simply. They did not accumulate wealth or love possessions for their own sake but kept things that were useful. The sheep they raised provided them with milk and butter, and wool for making their tents and clothing. As shepherds they often moved their dwellings to find pasture for their flocks. Some were more settled and tilled the ground to grow crops like fruit, vegetables and grain.

Marriage

Marriage was the chief source of their joy. People lived as happily married couples. Swedenborg spoke with a couple in the celestial or highest heaven who told him about “conjugal love”, the special marriage love they treasured. This love involves each partner loving the Lord, their spouse and others more than themselves. The Writings compare this special love to the way in which the heart and lungs work together in the body.

Swedenborg also described their beautiful clothing. The husband wore an outer blue robe over a white wool tunic. The wife wore a purple dress over a beautifully embroidered linen blouse. During the visit, the angel gave Swedenborg a pomegranate with seeds of gold as a symbol of the Most Ancient Church.

Social Structure

The people of Most Ancient Church did not live in cities. They did not have governments because there was no need to control others. Instead, they lived as tribes, households and families. When a family needed to make an important decision the father or patriarch would decide what to do. The relationship between the father and the family was like that of a parent and child. This social structure gave people an inner sense of peace.

The Fall of the Most Ancient Church

Despite this beautiful way of life, people gradually began to think differently. They wanted to feel more independent, and less connected with the Lord. They turned inwards and started seeing themselves as wise and intelligent. Consequently, they thought they were better than others. As they began to love themselves more than the Lord and other people, they closed their minds to the Lord and started to hate people who disagreed with them. They also began to eat meat. Adam and Eve’s temptation described in Genesis represents this change or “fall”. Yet, the Most Ancient Church did not end suddenly, but over many years. Its people divided into numerous groups, which are pictured in all Adam’s descendants. Noah’s “flood” pictures the final judgment which occurred at the very end of this church.

The Most Ancient Church and Our Lives

The Golden Age was like heaven on earth. We too can experience heaven on earth when we reject selfish and worldly thoughts. And like the most ancient people, we can only have genuine happiness when we are open to the Lord leading us through the Word and use the gift of conscience to help us walk with Him.
