# Old Testament Quotes: Prophecies of the Lord's Life

# \_1. Rejected by His own people

(Isaiah 53:3) He is despised and rejected by men, a Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.

# \_2. Palm Sunday

(Zechariah 9:9) "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; He is just and having salvation, lowly and riding on a donkey, A colt, the foal of a donkey."

### \_3. Betrayed for thirty pieces of silver

(Zechariah 11:12) Then I said to them, "If it is agreeable to you, give me my wages; and if not, refrain." So they weighed out for my wages thirty pieces of silver.

#### \_4. Accused by false witnesses

(Psalms 35:11) Fierce witnesses rise up; they ask me things that I do not know.

#### \_\_5. Silent to accusations

(Isaiah 53:7) He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth.

#### \_\_\_\_6. Spat on and struck

(Isaiah 50:6) I gave My back to those who struck Me, and My cheeks to those who plucked out the beard; I did not hide My face from shame and spitting.

#### \_7. Hated without reason

(Psalms 35:19) Let them not rejoice over me who are wrongfully my enemies; nor let them wink with the eye who hate me without a cause.

#### \_8. Scorned and mocked

(Psalms 22:7-8) All those who see Me ridicule Me; they shoot out the lip, they shake the head, saying, "He trusted in the Lord, let Him rescue Him; let Him deliver Him, since He delights in Him!"

#### \_9. Prayer for His enemies

(Psalms 109:4) In return for my love they are my accusers, but I give myself to prayer.

#### \_10. Soldiers gamble for His clothing

(Psalms 22:18) They divide My garments among them, and for My clothing they cast lots.

### \_\_\_11. Felt forsaken by God

(Psalms 22:1) My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me? Why are You so far from helping Me, and from the words of My groaning?

# New Testament Quotes: Fulfillment of Prophecies

**A. (Matthew 26:14-15)** Then one of the twelve, called Judas Iscariot went to the chief priests and said, "What are you willing to give me if I deliver Him to you?" And they counted out to him thirty pieces of silver.

**B. (Matthew 27:35-36)** Then they crucified Him, and divided His garments, casting lots, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet: "They divided My garments among them, and for My clothing they cast lots." Sitting down, they kept watch over Him there.

**C. (Mark 11:7-9)** Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their clothes on it, and He sat on it. And many spread their clothes on the road, and others cut down leafy branches from the trees and spread them on the road. Then those who went before and those who followed cried out, saying: "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!"

**D.** (Luke 23:34) Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."

**E. (Mark 14:57-58)** Then some rose up and bore false witness against Him, saying, "We heard Him say, I will destroy this temple made with hands, and within three days I will build another made without hands."

F. (Mark 15:4-5) Then Pilate asked Him again, saying, "Do You answer nothing? See how many things they testify against You!" But Jesus still answered nothing, so that Pilate marveled.

**G. (Matthew 26:67)** Then they spat in His face and beat Him; and others struck Him with the palms of their hands.

H. (John 15:24-25) "If I had not done among them the works which no one else did, they would have no sin; but now they have seen and also hated both Me and My Father. But this happened that the word might be fulfilled which is written in their law, "They hated Me without a cause."

I. (Matthew 27:46) And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" that is, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?"

**J. (John 1:11)** He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him.

**K.** (Luke 23:35) And the people stood looking on. But even the rulers with them sneered, saying, "He saved others; let Him save Himself if He is the Christ, the chosen of God."
