Materials Needed

Helping Friends Find the Lord Cards p. 3; bowl for cards; space for a running activity, e.g. a hallway, gym or outdoors; obstacles for an obstacle course, e.g. scarves, hats, cones, etc.

optional: “Footprints in the Sand” poem (see bit.ly/FootSand)

Prepare in Advance

Print *Helping Friends Find the Lord Cards* p. 3 on stiff paper. Cut apart and put in a bowl. Identify a space for the activity and set up an obstacle course that leads to the bowl with quotes in it. *Optional*: “Footprints” poem, printed. Use bit.ly/FootSand to find an attractive copy of the poem to print. (Enter bitly link in the web browser bar at the top of your screen.)

New Church Concept Take Up Your Bed

“Arise, take up your bed and walk,” signifies doctrine, and life according to it; “bed” signifies doctrine, and “to walk” life. See *Apocalypse Explained* 163.7

The man let down through the roof is an amazing story of friendship. Unable to move, a paralyzed man was brought to the Lord by four friends. The Lord changed their friend’s life by healing him. Explore the question of how we are to “carry” friends to the Lord by playing an active game.

1. Has a friend helped you when you were in need? What happened? How did your friend help?
2. Have you helped a friend in need? What happened? What called you to give help?
3. When the Lord was on earth He helped many people. The Lord is no longer with us in person, so how does He help today? What is our role in helping others?
4. Does the Lord need our help? The Lord once told a parable about sheep and goats which gives examples of human needs, e.g. hunger, thirst, etc. He ended by saying, “Inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.” (Matthew 25:40) In what way can this be seen as a call to action?
5. What is the most important or long-lasting help we can give others? Which is more important—to care for others’ worldly needs, or their spiritual needs? In what way are both important? Is it possible to care for another’s spiritual needs without also caring for their natural needs?
6. In the story of the man let down through the roof four friends brought the man to the Lord. The man was unable to move, or “stuck.” This task was difficult and involved creative thinking. How was their help crucial for the man in need of healing?
7. In what ways does the Lord call us to bring others to Him for healing? What might this look like in our lives, with the friends you know?

8. *Optional:* The famous poem, *Footprints in the Sand*, is about a person's walk through life with the Lord. Distribute copies of the poem and read aloud. How has the Lord "carried" you during your difficult times?
9. We're going to practice carrying others to the Lord. Divide students into groups of three. Two students will link arms to form a seat (see photo). A third student will sit on top and be carried.
10. The goal of the activity is to carry a friend through the obstacle course (life) to reach the bowl with quotes in it. The student will take an uplifting quote from the bowl as a reminder of the Lord's helpful and healing presence in their lives.
11. Repeat the activity until all have had an opportunity to be carried.
12. How did it feel to be carried? How did it feel to carry someone?
