- a. Judges become the primary people who bring the Lord's Word to Israel.
- b. Famine forces the Israelites to migrate to Egypt.
- c. The kingdom is divided into Judah and Israel.
- d. Israel is crushed by the Assyrians, and ten tribes are exiled (Ten Lost Tribes).
- e. The Patriarchs of the Israelites—Abraham, Isaac and Jacob— bring the belief in One God to the Promised Land where they settle.
- f. Moses leads the Israelites out of Egypt, followed by forty years of wandering in the desert.
- g. The Ten Commandments are received at Mount Sinai.
- h. Elijah and Elisha speak for the Lord and do miracles.
- i. Jerusalem is made the capital of David's Kingdom.
- j. The Israelites settle the land of Israel.
- k. Monarchy is established in Israel. Saul is made king.
- l. The first temple, the national and spiritual center of the Jewish people, is built in Jerusalem by King Solomon.
