# Forgiving the Woman Ages 3-6

## For an Individual or Group

#### **Materials Needed**

white shaving foam (not gel) in a spray can; water-based paint in a color of your choice (to color shaving foam); cup and small spoon for mixing paint; aluminum foil, 12 x 8" (30 x 20cm) for each child; piece of paper for each child; supplies for cleaning up optional: art smocks to keep clothing clean

#### **Prepare in Advance**


Purchase supplies. Divide aluminum foil into pieces for each child. Mix water-based paint.

## Writing in the Earth

While people tested the Lord, He bent down and wrote on the ground with His finger, as though He could not hear. We do not know what He wrote—but as He wrote, the woman's accusers left, until once alone with the woman. He told her to "Go, and sin no more." (John 8:11) This activity invites children to write a message as the Lord did.







- 2. What did the Lord say to the woman when all the people had gone?
- 3. The Lord also tells us we should not sin—do what we know is wrong. He wants us to love others and to do what is right.
- 4. We are going to write like the Lord, using our fingers!
- 5. To start with, we will roll up our sleeves. (Optional: put on art smocks.)
- Put a piece of aluminum foil on the table in front of each child.
- 7. Squirt some shaving foam on to the foil.
- 8. Spoon a small amount of paint on to the shaving foam.
- 9. Invite the children to mix the paint and foam with their hands until the foam is evenly colored.
- 10. Using one finger, write in the foam. Encourage children to go over the writing until they see the foil underneath, to ensure a good quality print.
- 11. Make a print of the writing by laying a piece of paper on top of it and then gently removing it. Allow to dry.
