

Analyzing the Lord's Prayer

Think about whether the phrases of the Prayer are requests or statements. Write an **S** before a phrase if it seems to be a statement and an **R** if it seems to be a request.

After each phrase, write "**praise**" if these words praise the Lord, "**confession**" if these words acknowledge our struggles with evil, "**petition**" if the words are asking the Lord to help us, and "**thanks**" if they are thanking the Lord our God.

After analyzing the Prayer in this way, reflect on why it is such a perfect prayer. You may want to write your reflections in your journal or discuss them with a friend.
