

MAKING A CLOTHESPIN FIGURE OF A PRIEST

Materials to make 1 Priest

- 1 wooden clothes pin
- 2 pipe cleaners, preferably white
- 2 sheets of 8 'A x 11 white paper
- yarn or fur for hair
- glue and scissors

Procedure for Making the Figure of a Priest

ROBE AND TUNIC:

1. Fold 1 sheet of paper in half, so that it measures 8 'A x 5 'A.
2. Use the tunic pattern (see below) or make something similar to fit your wooden clothespin.
3. If using this pattern, cut along the solid lines, and fold on the dotted lines.
4. Cut neck hole, and turn the paper inside out so that the lines of the pattern do not show.
5. Trim the bottom of the paper to fit your wooden pin.
6. Wrap a 6 inch piece of pipe cleaner around the neck of the pin, to make the arms.
7. Put paper tunic over the pin, and glue the sleeves closed at the bottom. Fold the sides of the skirt to the back of the Priest, and glue in place.
8. Cut a 1 ¼ inch strip of paper. Fold it in half, and cut a neck hole on the fold. Trim the hem of this robe 'A inch above the hem of the tunic. Place on the wooden pin, over the tunic.

SASH, HAIR AND TURBAN:

1. Tie a sash around the priest with a piece of pipe cleaner, or a twist-tie.
2. Glue on a reasonable amount of hair, and circle with a pipe cleaner to create a turban.
