### Notes for Parents & Teachers

#### 44. The Resurrection

- a) You can remind children of the last story and about Joseph of Arimathea and the tomb.
- b) Try to give them a picture of what the women thought when they saw the angel, and were running to tell the disciples, and, suddenly, there was the Lord standing in front of them, alive! Nothing like this had ever happened, nor would ever happen again. Only the Lord could do this. Point out that after this no one ever saw His supposedly dead body, for all of Him was now God.
- c) The women fell at His feet and touched only His feet.
- d) He told the women to tell the disciples that they should go to Galilee.
