Notes for Parents & Teachers

55. The Lord on the White Horse

- a) It is very important to emphasize that the Lord rode a white horse—remember the white horse stands for the truth that people love. So, when we love the truth we see the Lord, and He is powerful over everything.
- b) The Lord is so powerful. You might compare this description to the donkey and the colt (son of a donkey) that He rode on in the world, just before He was crucified. But now no one can challenge Him.
- c) Note the three names that the Lord has. The first one nobody knows except Himself. We can say that the Lord alone knows the whole truth. But He has two other names. One is “the Word of God,” for the Word is the Lord’s truth that we can see. And He’s called King of Kings and Lord of Lords because His truth rules all the earth.
- d) Note that the Lord’s garment was dipped in blood. This reminds us that people tried to kill Him on earth, but He rose again and rules this world and the next world.
