56. The Dragon Is Bound

- a) This story tells itself. Dramatize the “bottomless pit.” The dragon is locked away far down. He had chains on him, and a seal was put on the stone over the pit.
- b) Children may ask why the dragon was only there for a thousand years—can he then trick people again? The reason is that by that time people who loved the Lord’s truth would be heavenly and safe from the dragon.
