23. Moses and the Burning Bush

- a. Moses is up on a holy mountain when the angel calls him. Then God spoke to him!
- b. You might ask them if one could have a bush that burned without being burned up. So what was that fire? It was the Lord's love.
- c. Why did he have to take his shoes off because the ground is holy? We would put on our best shoes to go to a holy place. But the shoes he was wearing were the rough sandals that they used for wearing out of doors, and they would take them off when they came into a home. So it was a sign of respect.
- d. Remind them that the Egyptians were a huge people, with lots of soldiers. So we can understand why Moses thought he could never do this job.
- e. The main lesson is that even when things seem impossible, as they did to Moses, the Lord can help us if the thing is very important.
- f. Moses didn't speak well, so the Lord said that his brother Aaron could speak for him. Moses found the courage to go to Pharaoh, but Pharaoh would not let the people go.
