### Notes for Parents & Teachers

#### 8. The Tower of Babel

- a. This is a good story to just tell. Show them how the people had a wrong idea about how to get to heaven.
- b. Ask them how you really get to heaven—they will know the answer. You can't get there by building a big tower.
- c. The Lord saw that if they went on building the tower they would think they could do anything—and they would not think they needed the Lord.
- d. When He got them to talk different languages they could not work together. If you know a different language, or even a few words, say them to the children, and ask them what you said.
- e. The word “babel” means “confusion.” They were confused because they couldn't understand each other, so they went and lived in different places.
