

Crossing the Red Sea—A Diorama

Exodus 14

Materials:

shades of blue tissue paper for making the waters of the Red Sea
clay or pipe-cleaners to make figures
optional: paper and crayons or colored pencils to make a backdrop

Procedure:

1. Make clay or pipe-cleaner figures.
2. Crumble the tissue paper in a way that suggests water, separated by a strong east wind.
3. Make a sign for the display as shown below (quoting Exodus 14:21, 22).

The Red Sea Divided

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the Lord caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on dry ground, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left (Ex.14: 21, 22).
