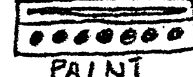

Subject: Elisha and Naaman

Age Group: Beginners: 3-5

Basic supplies:



Materials: staplers

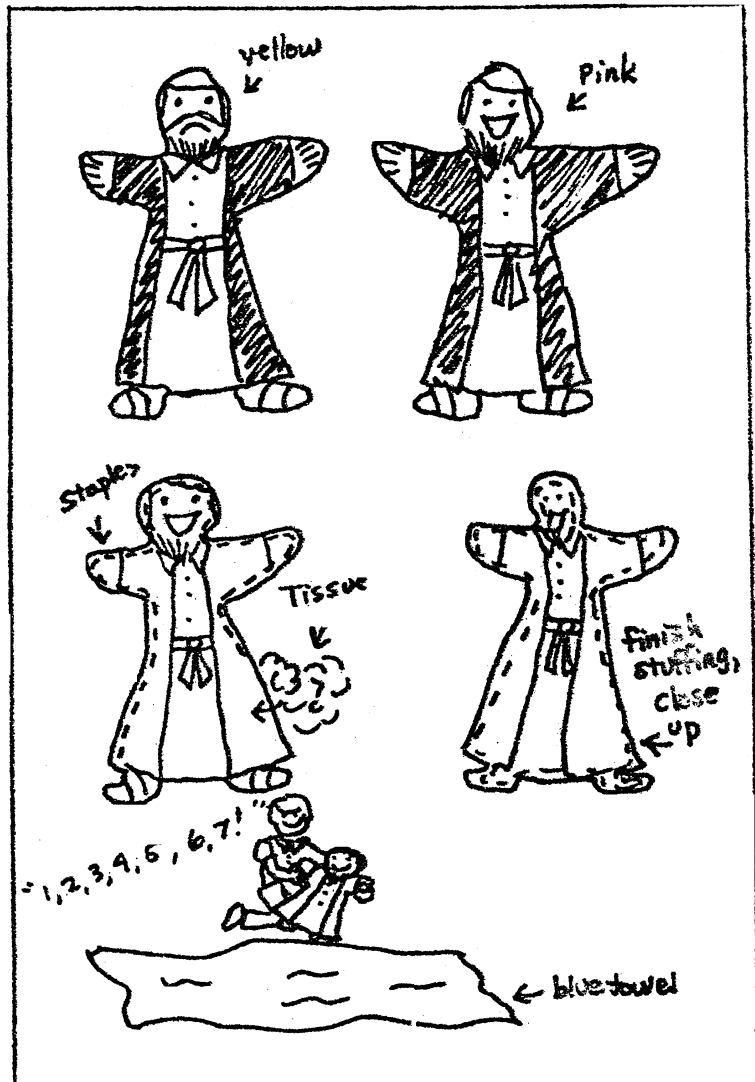
- large yellow construction paper
- large pink construction paper
- Crayons
- tissue paper or newspaper

Teacher preparation:

- cut out basic Naaman shapes, one yellow and one pink for each child (the same size, shape)
- set up something to represent the Jordan (blue towel, bucket of water, picture of a river etc.)

Procedure:

- on yellow side, children color a sad Naaman
- on pink side they color a happy Naaman
- staple together edges and stuff with tissue as you go
- give each child a chance to dip their Naaman 7 times in the Jordan to turn to healthy pink! (turn doll over)



notes: if outline is symmetrical you won't have to worry about right & wrong sides for them to color
