GLENVIEW NEW CHURCH SUNDAY MORNING PROGRAM Primary Lessons: Phase 2, Lesson 21 Hell

I. Underlying Ideas for the Teacher

- A. Hell is the opposite of heaven.
- B. The Lord does not send anyone to hell; evil people cast themselves into hell.
- C. The universals of heaven are: love of ruling from the love of use; love of possessing the goods of the world from the love of performing uses by their means; love truly conjugial. The universals of hell are: love of ruling from the love of self; love of possessing the goods of others from the love of the world; scortatory love.
- D. The Lord governs both heaven and hell, maintaining a balance between them so that people can be in freedom.
- E. There are angels of various heavens who govern the hells. They inspect the hells, moderate them, and keep them in order. (HH 543; AC 8237)
- F. The evil spirits in hell are governed by fear of penalties for doing evil, for this is the only means of controlling their ferocity. (HH 543)
- G. The Lord desires to limit the misery of the evil spirits as much as He can, protecting them from themselves. (HH 595)
- H. Evil spirits believe that they are powerful, but they can win against only those who are in evil.
- I. All power against evil is from the Lord. (AE 209:3)
- J. All in hell perform uses, but they are the poorest kinds of uses.

II. Story Circle

- A. Introduce the Story
 - 1. Remember that the Lord gives everyone in the spiritual world a body, clothes, home, and so on that match the kind of love he has inside.
 - a. The angels in heaven have good loves: they love the Lord, and they love other people. So they have beautiful bodies, homes, and clothes.

- b. The evil spirits in hell have bad loves: they love themselves and the world more than anything else, and they hate everything that is good and true. So the evil spirits have ugly bodies, rags for clothes, and dirty, tumbledown houses to match the bad loves they have inside.
- 2. Hell isn't a nice place at all. It's awful! The light is very dim, so the evil spirits can hardly see through the fog, mists, and smoke that fill the air. The smells there are the worst you can possibly imagine. And there are fierce animals and ugly plants there.
- 3. Would you like to live in a place like that? Of course not! But the evil spirits love all the ugliness of hell because it matches the ugliness of the loves they have inside them.
- B. Read the Story
 - 1. Read the attached, "An Angel Talks About Hell."
- C. Ideas to Discuss
 - 1. What was Daniel's job in the world? (He was a policeman; he liked to protect people from those who do bad things.)
 - 2. What was Daniel's job in heaven? (Helping the Lord govern the hells)
 - 3. What happened to an evil spirit if Daniel looked at him in a certain way? (He would fall to the ground and be still.)
 - 4. The Lord allowed Daniel and Nathan to see into hell. What did Nathan see when he first looked into hell? (At first he saw wild beasts running in the forest.)
 - 5. Then they saw an evil spirit. What did he look like? (He looked terrible: He had fierce, glowing eyes, ragged clothes, smoke coming from his mouth, and bony ankles instead of feet.)
 - 6. What did that evil spirit love most? (To be more important than anyone else and to tell everyone what to do)
 - 7. What did he think he was? (King over all kings. He would sit on a throne and make lots of rules.)
 - 8. Did the evil spirit spend all of his time pretending to be a king over all kings? (No, he had to work part of each day for food and clothing.)
 - 9. Daniel told Nathan about one time when he met an evil spirit in the world of spirits who was boasting of his great power. What made him cry out in horror and throw himself back into hell? (A tiny baby from heaven)
 - 10. The evil spirits under Daniel's supervision wanted to be more important than everyone else. What do some of the other evil spirits in hell love or want to do? (Lie to people and trick them; have lots of money, rob people; hurt marriages; hate people and want to murder them)
 - 11. What do all evil spirits have in common? (They refuse to let the Lord lead them; they want to lead themselves.)

- 12. Does the Lord love the evil spirits? (Yes, He loves them even though they are very bad. He takes care of them and tries to make them as happy as He can.)
- 13. Do the evil spirits want to leave hell to live somewhere else? (No, they like living in hell because they can do bad things there.)
- 14. At the end of the story, Nathan decided what kind of work he wanted to do to help the Lord. What was it? (Govern the hells)
- 15. How do the angels help the Lord govern the hells? (The Lord allows them to see into the hells. They make sure the evil spirits aren't hurting each other too much. And they protect good people from the evil spirits. Sometimes the angels go into hell to calm things down.)

B. Activities

- C. Project
 - The Evil Spirit: Have children use red and orange chalk or oil pastels (crayons will do) on black construction paper to draw a picture of the evil spirit described in the story: fierce, glowing eyes; ragged clothes smoke coming from his mouth (gray?); and bony ankles instead of feet. They could add some ugly plants or a tumbledown shack of a house, but have the evil spirit be the focus of the project.
 - 2. King Over All Kings: Using the same materials as above, have children depict an evil spirit on a throne ruling over others. Better yet, they could draw several spirits on thrones to show that all of them in this particular hell want to rule over the rest.

AN ANGEL TALKS ABOUT HELL

"LOOK again, Nathan. Tell me what you see now," replied Daniel.

"There is an evil spirit who looks terrible. He is dressed in rags. His eyes are fierce and glowing, and he has smoke coming from his mouth. He has no feet, just bony ankles without any flesh!" exclaimed Nathan. "Why does he look like that?"

Both Daniel and Nathan felt it was a shame that the evil spirits wouldn't let the Lord help them be happier than this.

Daniel continued. "There are many more evil spirits who want to be in charge. Some of them try to control others through trickery or by threatening to hurt them. They hate people who love the Lord because they have no power over them. They wish they could hurt good people and make them unhappy, but the Lord won't let them."

"Are you in charge of that part of hell?" asked Nathan.

"No, the Lord governs the hells, and He has many angels helping Him. I am just one of the angels helping Him with this part of hell. We keep the evil spirits from hurting each other too much. They are very cruel to each other, you see. We also protect the people in the world of spirits and on earth from these wicked spirits."

Then Nathan asked him, "How do you do it? How do you supervise the evil spirits?"

The evil spirit couldn't stand to be near the sweet innocence of the baby. He cried out in horror and threw himself into hell!"

Daniel stopped talking to look into hell again. He saw an evil spirit there who was being punished for doing something very bad. The other evil spirits were allowed to punish him, but they were being too cruel to him. Nathan didn't know how it happened, but suddenly the evil spirit was freed from those who were tormenting him. Daniel had helped him. Nathan could see why the Lord had angels helping Him govern the hells.

"Are the other parts of hell like this?" asked Nathan.

"No. Hell has just as much variety as heaven. There are many societies in hell, and they are all different from each other. Some evil spirits love to lie to people and trick them. Other evil spirits want lots of money; many of them are robbers. Some evil spirits hate true marriage love, and they try to hurt marriages. And there are evil spirits who are so filled with hatred that they want to murder people. Each evil spirit is different from the others, but they all have one thing in common.
