VISION OF THE LORD

Revelation 1:9-20

OVERVIEW OF THE STORY

John's first vision was a wonderful sight of the glorified Lord. In this vision the Lord was standing in the middle of seven golden lampstands. The whole vision is one of brightness and comfort. The Lord's message to John was to write what he saw to the seven churches.

CONCEPTS FOR PARENTS AND TEACHERS

- * The risen and glorified Lord is the One God of heaven and earth.
- John had known the Lord on earth and recognized Him, now glorified, in this first vision.
- This light-filled vision pictures the Lord's truth lighting our path in life when we open the eyes of our mind and recognize Him.
- * The golden lampstands picture Divine truth. When we come to love truth, we can clearly see by the light of truth how the Lord and His love resides in the center of this truth.
- The golden girdle is Divine love encircling the Lord. Divine love encircles us when we love the Lord for His own sake, that is, because He is good, and not just for the sake of what He can do for us.
- * The sharp two-edged sword pictures truth which defends what is good in us and it casts away evil that tries to attack us.
- This powerful vision was a comfort to John and should be to us as we learn to let the Lord transform our lives from being merely natural to being spiritual.

VISION OF THE LORD

IMPORTANT IDEAS FOR CHILDREN

The Lord appeared dressed in white and surrounded by light. The light of the Lord's truth helps us learn about Him and see Him.

LFT'S REMEMBER:

- We are reading from the Book of Revelation. What does revelation mean? (To show or reveal.)
- Who wrote this book? (John.)
- Was it John the Baptist or John the disciple? (Disciple.)
- · At the time of our story John was sent to the Isle of Patmos. Do you remember why? (Because the Roman rulers did not want him to tell people about the Lord Jesus Christ.)
- John could still write letters. How many churches was he in charge of? (Seven.)



OUR STORY FOR TODAY:

One Sunday, which is called the Lord's day, the Lord opened John's spiritual eyes and ears so that he could see and hear wonderful things. John heard a loud voice that made him turn around and look. Let's see how the voice sounded and what it said.



Read Revelation 1:9-11.

Do you know what "in the spirit" means? (His spiritual eyes and ears were opened.)

What did the voice sound like? (A trumpet.)

Do you remember what "the Alpha and the Omega" means? (The Beginning and the End; the First and the Last.)

What did the voice tell John to do? (Write what he saw to the seven churches.)

Now we will find out what John

saw when he turned around. The Lord appeared to John. John recognized the Lord right away because he had known and loved the Lord while He was on earth. Now the Lord was glorious or full of glory and surrounded by shinning light. Try to picture the Lord in your mind as you listen to the vision.



Read Revelation 1:12-16.

Whom did John see? (The Lord.)

How many golden
lampstands were around
Him? (Seven.) At this time in
history people did not have
candles. They used to burn oil
in containers for light. Putting the
lamps on stands raised them up so the light would
spread further.

What did the Lord look like? (Hair white like wool or snow, eyes like fire, feet like brass, two-edged sword coming out of His mouth, face like sun shining brightly.)

What did His voice sound like now? (Many waters.)

What did the Lord have in His right hand? (Seven stars.)



This is a very bright picture, full of light. John must have been very surprised to see this amazing sight. And yet he must have been very happy to see the Lord in such a glorious manner. When he saw the Lord, John fell down at His feet to worship Him. The Lord told him not to be afraid but to write to the seven churches. Then He told John a mystery.



Read Revelation 1:17-20.

What is the mystery of the seven stars? (They picture the angels of the seven churches.)

What was revealed about the lampstands? (They stand for the seven churches.)

This was to show that the Lord was near His church in heaven and in the world. He was caring for both. This vision gave John a comforting and encouraging message to send to the people in these seven churches. It makes us feel good when we remember that the Lord is near.

Do you think the Lord is taking care of all of those who love Him today and always? (Yes.)

Because He gave us the Word, everyone for all time can learn to know the Lord and learn His truths to help them live happy lives.



WHAT DID WE LEARN TODAY?

- What does "in the spirit" mean? (Having your spiritual eyes and ears opened so you can experience heavenly things.)
- Whom did John see when he was in the spirit? (The Lord.)
- What did the Lord look like? (He had white hair, eyes like fire, feet like brass, two-edged sword coming out of His mouth, face like the sun.)
- What was in His right hand? (Seven stars.)
- Do you remember what those seven stars stand for? (The angels of the seven churches.)
- How many lampstands stood around the Lord? (Seven.)
- Do you remember what the lampstands picture? (The seven churches John was writing to.)
- Do you think it made John happy to know that the Lord was taking good care of those churches? (Yes.)
- How would you feel if you were to see the Lord like this?

VISION OF THE LORD ACTIVITIES

Additional Activities:

Vision of the Lord


Picture the Lord as He appeared to John on the Isle of Patmos.


Supplies:

1 printed page 1 piece of blue paper crayons glitter glue

Project instructions:

- 1. Color the Lord's face and hands.
- 2. Color His feet to look like brass (use orange or brown).
- 3. Cut out the figure and glue it in the center of the blue paper.
- 4. Draw seven lampstands around the Lord.
- 5. Draw a small two-edged sword near the Lord's mouth and seven stars in His right hand.
- 6. Add glitter to the Lord's girdle, the seven lampstands, and the sword.
