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

Text: Jonah 3; 4

procedure:

Discuss the many feelings in the story. Read story slowly to children as they close their eyes. Then discuss "good" & "bad" forms of each emotion. Try to have them pretend they are Jonah, and experience feelings. Make a list.

Emotions, or feelings in Jonah story:	
<u>good:</u>	<u>bad:</u>
1. of hurting others	<u>FEAR</u> of being found out when misbehaving
2. protecting the weak from harm	<u>REVENGE</u> spite
3. humility, asking for help	<u>DISPAIR</u> giving up on the LORD
4. excusing evil	<u>MERCY</u> forgiving to repentant
