basic supplies:



materials: wax (old candles, paraffin)

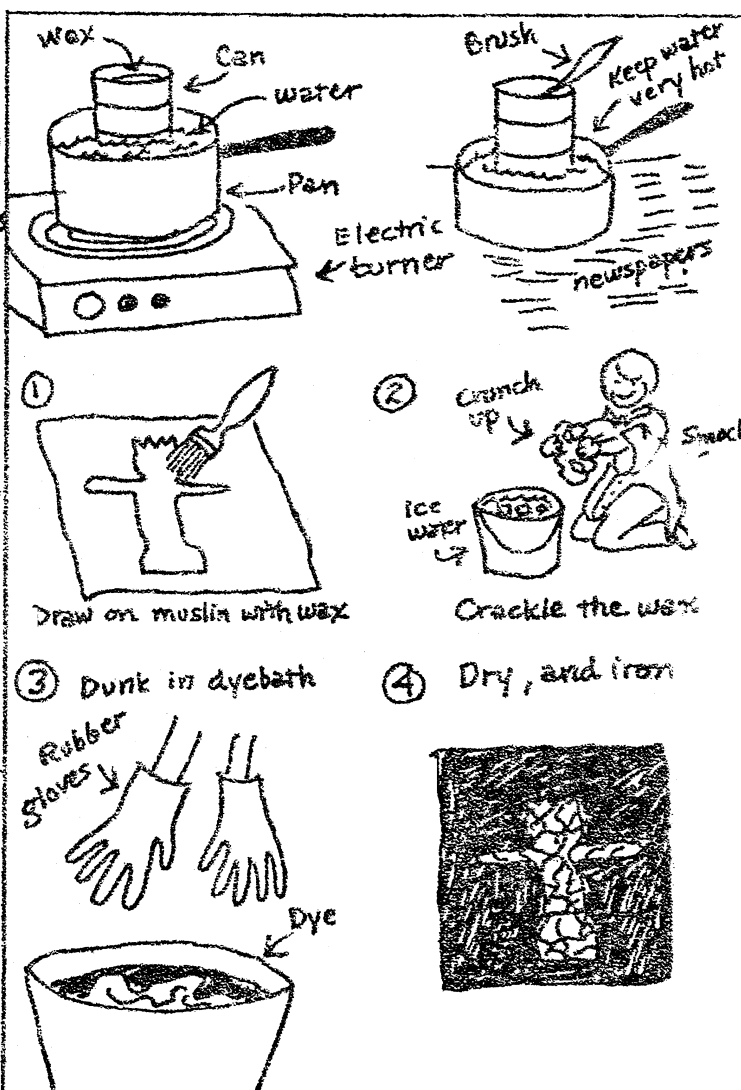
- small electric burner, or camping stove etc.
- old pan and tin cans (coffee can)
- old brushes (various widths) (or cotton swabs)
- muslin or other plain white cotton swabs
- cold water dyes, water, ice
- newspaper, buckets, smocks, rubber gloves

Teacher preparation:

- melt wax in can, in pan of water, before class (keep hot w hot water)
- spread newspapers
- prepare dye or dyes before class according to directions
- cut muslin into pieces for "drawing" on with wax, one per child
- fill a bucket with ice water

procedure: dip brush in wax,

- using brushes, draw one of the images, high places, priests, horses, weavings, chariots or other idolatrous things that King Josiah burned, broke or destroyed (chapter 23) (redip brush often to keep wax on brush as hot as possible)
- put waxed muslin picture in ice water and get it cold, then crunch up in your hands to crackle wax
- dunk in bucket of dye (according to directions) (use rubber gloves)
- let dry ~ dye should seep into cracks of wax, and make the idol look broken
- iron between newspapers to remove wax (could be done the next week or at home, or even when not perfectly dry)



NOTES: the directions on the dye package are to insure fairly permanent color (washable) but you do not need such permanence, so if you do not soak as long as recommended, that's OK
