PETER SERVES THE LORD

Story Strips of Peter's Life

Jesus saw two brothers, Simon Peter and Andrew, casting a fishing net into the Sea of Galilee. And He said, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." And they left their nets and followed Him. (Matthew 4:18-20)

Then Jesus appointed twelve of his followers to be His disciples, and Simon (named Peter by the Lord) was one of them.

The Lord took Peter, James, and John with Him when He healed the daughter of Jairus, bringing her back to life here on earth. (Mark 5:35-42)

The Lord and Peter walked on the water. (Matthew 14:25-31)

The Lord took Peter, James, and John to a high mountain to see Him transfigured, His face shining like the sun, and His clothes as white as the light. (Matthew 17:1-9)

Peter asked what reward the Lord would give His disciples for leaving all and following Him. (Matthew 19:27)

The Lord sent Peter and John to prepare the Passover, and the Lord sat down with the twelve disciples, and He gave them the bread and the wine. (Luke 22:8-20)

Peter told the Lord that he was ready to stand by the Lord even if it meant prison or death. But the Lord told Peter that he would deny knowing the Lord three times before the rooster would crow the next morning. (Luke 22:33-34)

After the Lord prayed in Gethsemane, Judas led the soldiers of the high priest to capture the Lord. And Peter drew a sword and cut off the right ear of a servant of the high priest. But Jesus told him to put the sword away, and He healed the man's ear. (John 18, Luke 22:51)

After He was risen, the Lord appeared to Simon Peter. (Luke 24:34)

They took Jesus away to the high priest, and Peter followed to see what would happen. And while Peter waited, three people recognized him as one of the Lord's disciples. But Peter denied knowing the Lord three times, and then a rooster crowed. And Peter left and wept bitterly. (Matthew 26:69-75)

The Lord was crucified, and they buried Him in a tomb. And chief priests and Pharisees sealed the large stone at the door of the tomb and set soldiers to guard the entrance. (Matthew 27)

And there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and rolled back the stone from the door and sat on it. And the guards shook for fear of him, and became like dead men. (Matthew 28)

Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and other women came to the tomb and saw the angel who told them that the Lord had risen and to go tell the disciples. Peter ran to the tomb to see for himself, and he marveled at what had happened. (Mark 16:1-7, Luke 24:12)

And Jesus appeared to the disciples and said, "Peace be to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." (John 20:19-22)

The Lord came to some disciples while they fished on the Sea of Tiberias. They caught many fish when He told them to cast the net on the right side of the boat. When John recognized the Lord, Peter swam from the boat to meet Him on the shore. And the Lord gave them bread and fish to eat for breakfast. (John 21)

The Lord came to the eleven disciples in Galilee and said, "Go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28)

And the disciples went out and preached everywhere, and the Lord worked with them so they could heal and preach the gospel. (Mark 16)
