

## Pretend that You Are Visiting Heaven

Play beautiful music—preferably soft, instrumental music.

Have everyone put on (or pretend to put on) an “angel garment.” These could be large new white T-shirts (with a colorful strip of fabric tied around the waist) or a large piece of colored silk tied as a cape.

Angels love to be kind and useful so make cookies to take to another family (or class). Or do something else that benefits other people.

Talk about the way angels would act in different situations.

Read a story set in heaven. Try a story from *Michael and the Zentrans* by the Rev. Andrew Dibb, *Johnny Appleseed and Other Stories* by the Rev. Kurt Horigan Asplundh, or *The Life to Come* by Gretchen L. Keith.

If you have been learning about heaven, have each person tell about one aspect of heaven, such as homes or clothing in heaven.

Sing the “Angel Song” by Lori Odhner or “Every Child in Heaven Has a Garden Bright.”

Eat fruit, slices of quick bread (such as pumpkin or apricot bread) or little cakes, and other foods that may be eaten in heaven.
