Fiery Furnace Wax Resist Picture


This is a fun project to show what happened when Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego were put in the fiery furnace because they wanted to worship God instead of a golden image (see Daniel 3). You are going to use the crayons to draw the three men and the angel. Then you will paint red, yellow and orange paint over the men and the angel to show the fire in the furnace.

Supplies


white wax crayon (or white oil pastel) various colors of wax crayon (or oil pastels) white paper watercolor paints

Procedure

- 1. Use crayons (or oil pastels) to draw three men on the white paper. Use *lots* of crayon and color the faces of the men too!
- 2. Draw an angel with white crayon (or oil pastel). You may want to make a yellow outline for the angel and then fill in with *lots* of white crayon.
- 3. Use watercolor paints to make red, orange, and yellow flames all over the picture (over and around the figures).
- 4. As you paint, you will still see the three men and the white angel will "appear." The fire could not hurt them.



Use yellow crayon to make the outline of the angel, then fill in with lots of white crayon!
