
Learn by Doing



In the story of the burning bush, the Lord asked Moses to do a difficult job convince Pharaoh to let the children of Israel leave Egypt. Moses was afraid that he wouldn't be able to do it. And he couldn't have, without the Lord's help.

This activity shows children that even though doing the right thing can be difficult, with the Lord's help, we can be happy and useful.



- 2. We're going to read a story about a girl who was having trouble doing things. When the story starts, her name is "Can't".
- 3. Read the book to the children. Then hand out copies of the book and have them color the pictures.
- 4. Read the story again, then ask the children to think about something that is hard for them, e.g. tying their shoes or making their bed. Remind them that no matter what it is, it is not too hard for the Lord. Talk about how the Lord can help them. Hand out the page *This is hard but the Lord can help me do it!* (p. 7) and ask them to draw a picture of themselves doing a hard job with the Lord's help.

Instructions for Assembling "I Can't But the Lord Can" Booklet



Stack numbered pages in order, 1-8.



Wrap cover around the inside pages so their cut edges are against the fold of the cover.



Put staples on the left side of the cover, making sure to catch all inside edges.

Materials Needed

copy of *I Can't but the Lord Can* (pp. 2-6) and *This is hard but the Lord can help me do it!* (p. 7) for each child, paper cutter or scissors, sta-pler, crayons or markers

Prepare in Advance

Make a **single sided** copy of pp. 2-6 for each student. Cut off the bottom of pp. 2-6 on the solid lines. Fold each page in half with the pictures on the outside. The numbered pages are the inner pages of the book. See book assembly directions below.






