















RAINBOW METHOD OF LEARNING THE 23RD PSALM

Cut apart the verses of this beautiful psalm. A parent or older child can hide the passages for a younger child. The searcher must “follow” the poem in a path through the house. To find the passages, a child must “follow” the poem. The rainbow colors key the child to keep searching for the passages in the right sequence. (Review the colors of the rainbow if necessary: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet.)

Alternative: Make your own rainbow strips, writing the verses on different colors of paper. Use the rainbow order when writing the verses: Red for "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." Orange for "He makes me lie down in green pastures," and so on. If you do not have colored papers, you could use different color pencils or pens to write on white paper.
