

Joseph's Dreams

Level A

Genesis 37:3-11

Ages 3-6

Life Focus: Dreaming about becoming a good or useful person can help us become one.

Memory Verse: Now Joseph dreamed a dream and he told it to his brothers. Genesis 37:5

Story Summary: Joseph was Jacob's favorite son. Jacob showed his love by giving Joseph a special colorful coat. Joseph had two dreams as a teenager. First he dreamed that he was binding sheaves of grain with his family, and that his brothers' sheaves bowed down to his sheaf. Later he dreamed that the sun and moon and eleven stars bowed down to him. He shared his dreams with his family. His brothers were jealous and hated him, but his father remembered them.

1. Getting Started

Welcome Warm-up Activity

Roll a ball to each child

Materials needed: soft inside ball

Seat students in a circle on the floor. Roll the ball to any child. As the child catches the ball, he or she says his or her name and rolls the ball back to you. Repeat until everyone has had a turn. Change the game! Roll the ball to a child. As children catch the ball, they will call out the name of another child they want to catch it, and roll the ball towards that child. Repeat until everyone has had a turn.

2. Focus on the Word

Read Genesis 37:3-11

Show the **teaching pictures** on pp. 9-11 as you discuss the story.

Talk Optional: A "coat of many colors" for children and/or the teacher to put on.

About It Jacob had twelve sons. Jacob loved his sons, but Joseph was his favorite. What did Jacob give Joseph? A special coat. *Optional:* show the "coat of many colors" and imagine how handsome Joseph must have looked in his special coat.

How do you think Joseph's brothers felt about the special coat? They were probably jealous and hated the special coat because it was a sign that Joseph was their father's favorite son. They said mean things to Joseph.

Have you ever felt upset when someone gets something special and you do not? Imagine if I gave one of you a special snack just for you! How might your friends feel about this? This feeling is jealousy. Let's say "jealous" together.

When he was a teenager Joseph dreamed that he and his brothers were making sheaves of grain. They would cut the wheat, tie it into bundles and stand it up so that the grain could dry out and be stored. What did his brothers' sheaves do in Joseph's dream? Bowed down to Joseph's sheaf.

What did Joseph see in his next dream? The sun and moon and eleven stars bowing down to him.

Joseph's dreams were about things that would happen when he had grown up—but he was just a teenager so nobody knew that they would come true!

Have you ever dreamed about things you might do when you are grown up? Have you ever dreamed about being a hero—or doing something really well? Have you every dreamed about going to heaven? We can have many different kinds of dreams.

What is one dream you have for your life? Invite each child to briefly share a dream.

Dreams are important. When we have dreams we can set goals to make them come true. Dreams can help us become the Lord's useful servants. Much later, when Joseph was grown up, his dreams did come true. He became a very important ruler in Egypt and helped his whole family!

3. Learn by Doing

Choose one or two activities



The Sun, Moon and Stars Bow Down

Make a crown of stars and a sun and moon "puppet" for each hand. Act out Joseph's dream of the sun, moon and stars bowing down to him.

- 1. *Optional:* Decorate the sun, moon and stars with crayons, glitter, etc.
- 2. Tape star strip together at both ends to create a crown.
- 3. Form puppet hand holders by overlapping the ends of each short strip to form a circle. Tape ends.
- 4. Tape one circle to the back of the sun and one to the back of the moon.
- 5. Help children put on the crowns and slip their hands into puppet holders.
- 6. Now imagine Joseph's dream! Choose a volunteer to be Joseph. Seat children in a circle and stand Joseph in the center. *Optional:* dress Joseph in the "coat of many colors". *Let's all pretend we are Joseph's brothers and bow down to him!* Give others turns being Joseph if they wish.



Choice ₹ The Sheaves Bow Down

Learn a rhyme about Joseph's dreams of the sheaves, and of the sun, moon and stars bowing down. Act out the rhyme.

1. Say the following rhyme one line at a time and invite the children to repeat each line after you.

Joseph went to sleep at night And dreamed a special dream. He saw his brothers binding sheaves And his sheaf stood supreme!

He lay back down and slept again And dreamed a dream once more. The sun and moon and 'leven stars Bowed down upon the floor.

2. Stand children in a circle to represent Joseph's brothers. Ask for a volunteer to stand in the center and be Joseph.

Directions continued on the next page.

Materials for each child

a copy of *Sun, Moon and Stars* p. 12 (recommend printing on stiff paper), scissors, 6 pieces tape (1.5in/4 cm)

Preparation: Cut apart student page on dotted lines using a paper cutter or scissors. Set out supplies.

Optional crayons, glue, silver or gold glitter, glitter tray, 'coat of many colors' for a child or teacher to wear

Quick Tips

Cutting help needed? Shorten waiting (eliminate boredom!) by cutting out project pieces ahead of time. Stack and use paper cutter if available.

Cut tape into pieces of the right length and stick them to the edge of the table at each child's place ready for use!

Activity: The Sheaves Bow Down continued

3. Repeat the rhyme with hand motions.

Joseph went to sleep at night
And dreamed a special dream.

He saw his brothers binding sheaves
And his sheaf stood supreme!

Fold hands under head and lay head on one side

Lean head and hands in the opposite direction

Stand with feet apart and hands in the air like a sheaf

Joseph stands while all others bow facing him

Pause to stand again

He lay back down and slept again And dreamed a dream once more The sun and moon and 'leven stars Bowed down upon the floor. Fold hands under head and lay head on one side Lean head and hands in the opposite direction

Sun-circle arms around head; moon-hands up; stars-wiggle fingers

Kneel on floor with arms out in front; Joseph stands

4. Repeat. Offer different children turns to be Joseph.

Hand out copies of the picture and invite the children to color it.

Materials

picture for each child (p. 13) crayons, markers, or colored pencils

4. Wrap It Up

Memory Verse

Now Joseph dreamed a dream and he told it to his brothers. Genesis 37:5


Read the Memory Verse aloud. Repeat it slowly several times. Invite the children to say it with you. Say "Now Joseph dreamed a dream." Ask the children to repeat it with you. Say "and he told it to his brothers." Ask the children to repeat it with you. Say the whole sentence and have children repeat it with you.

Closing

The Lord's dream for each of us is that we become a useful person in His heavenly kingdom. Have you ever dreamed about becoming an angel? When we share the Lord's dream for us, and do what He asks us to in His Word, He can help make the dream of becoming an angel come true!


