THE EXODUS Review Cards for the Exodus Story

(from the books of Exodus, Numbers, and Leviticus)

Preparing the Cards

Photocopy onto cardstock or cover stock and then cut apart along the lines. (A paper cutter will make quick work of this task.)

Ways to Use These Cards

1. Sequencing Cards

Let groups of children work together to put the cards in order. (This will be easier if you do this several times throughout the year, only giving them pictures for the stories that you have already discussed.)

2. Storyline Cards

Use the cards for a pictorial storyline for graphing whether events are happy, sad, or somewhere in between. Lay a long piece of cord or tape on a straight line on the floor. If an event is happy, put the card above the line. If an event is sad, put it below the line. Continue until all the cards are in the storyline, stopping for discussion as needed to determine where each card belongs.

3. Review Cards

Let pairs or small groups of children work together, taking turns drawing cards and briefly telling about the story or thing depicted.

4. My Favorite Story

Lay out the review cards as a way to help children remember the stories of the Exodus. Let each child select a favorite story to illustrate and tell about in his or her own words. This could be done as a poster or as a book with several illustrations.
