# Lesson 34: THE MARRIAGE GARDEN Conjugial Love 316

# Lesson 34-A

#### **READING:**

Read to the students *The Marriage Garden*, by Melinda Riley Friesen (based on *Conjugial Love* 316). (The text of this story is included with this lesson.)

#### **PROJECT**

### **Preparation**

- 1. Ahead of time, get a poster board (white or light blue), large pieces of green construction paper, and a supply of many colors of paper. Letter stencils would also be useful.
- 2. Make the grass by cutting and gluing on large pieces of green paper. The grass should go at least half way up the poster, and be rounded into gentle hills at the top.
- 3. Out of white or light gray paper, cut and glue on a path to go through the garden. Keep in mind that the children might want to make a house at the end of the path.

**Note:** Steps 2 and 3 may be done with students during Sunday School but will take more time.

#### **Procedure:**

- 1. Remind the children that everything in this marriage garden appeared in pairs. The fruit trees that were along either side of the path (or avenue) had their branches intertwined. These fruit trees formed a wall on either side of the avenue.
- 2. Have the children draw, cut out, and glue on things to go in the garden.
  - a) Remember that the trees on either side of the avenue were <u>fruit</u> trees, and had their branches intertwined.
  - b) Remember that everything in the garden came in twos, to represent marriage (pairs of flowers and shrubs).
  - c) If any students are willing, it would be nice to place a house in the garden, with a bride and groom in front of it.
  - d) Have someone use the stencils to draw and cut out letters for form a title: **A**Marriage Garden to glue across the top of the poster.
  - e) Find a good place to glue on the quote from *Conjugial Love* 316.

# Lesson 34-B

#### **READING:**

If there are children who were not there last time, maybe re-read *The Marriage Garden* so they know what the project is about.

Read aloud *The Angel Visitors*, retold by Michéle Bongers Smith, as another description of marriage in heaven. (The text of this story is included with this lesson.)

Emphasize the wonderful truth that the Lord has a special partner for *everyone*. Some find that person on earth, and others find that person in heaven.

#### **PROJECT:**

Now work with the children to finish the poster project started last time.

They may want to add pairs of animals to the garden scene. (Just make sure they are nice animals, such as would appear in heaven.)

When I first did this project, students also added a pair of clouds and a double rainbow.

Make a copy of the quote below. Cut it out to use on the poster.

### **Quote for Poster**

Swedenborg was invited into a garden in which a wedding was taking place.

"The avenue by which I entered was an avenue of fruit trees joined together by their branches, thus forming a continuous wall of trees on either side. Through this avenue I passed into a small garden which breathed a pleasant fragrance from its shrubs and flowers.
