1. Guess

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The Shepherds Visit

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Guess

Read the following words to students one word at a time. Students will guess what topic they will discuss. (Note: *Phrases in* ()— *are to help the teacher understand how the words relate to the lesson theme. They are not to be shared!*)

- 1. Evil (Shepherd protects from evil)
- 2. Lead (*Shepherd leads to safety and good pasture*)
- 3. Visit (Angel visits shepherds; shepherds visit the Lord)
- 4. Protect (Shepherd protects his sheep)
- 5. Angels (Angels announce the good news)
- 6. Return (Shepherds return glorifying and praising God)

Read and Discuss

One of the features of the Word is that when we see its spiritual meaning, all of its characters are parts of ourselves.

Mary = affection for true ideas

Joseph = understanding of true ideas that support a good life in us

Jesus born into the world = the Lord becoming a real part of our life

Angels (messengers) = insights that flow in from the Lord

King Herod = a wish to control things for our own advantage

Sheep = good feelings, innocent affections; things that make a happy and good life

Shepherds = those who teach and lead to useful service

- 1. What part might shepherds represent in us ? Keep in mind the job of a shepherd.
- 2. What were the shepherds doing when the angels appeared?

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- 3. Look at what sheep are in us (on the previous page). Why would our love for good things need to be taken care of? What might threaten our good loves? (*Hint*: Think about why sheep need tending. What dangers threaten sheep? What related spiritual dangers do innocent affections face?)
- 4. How do shepherds (and the community where they live) suffer if shepherds do not manage their sheep—a source of food and clothing—well?
- 5. Shepherds care for sheep so the sheep provide meat and wool. Sheep and wool are the useful products of their hard work. Why is connecting what we know with what we love *to produce good things* important for leading a healthy life? (See sidebar on right.)
- 6. What are the "spiritual shepherds" in us?
- 7. How can the true ideas we know from the Word give us a sense of direction and purpose? How can true ideas lead us to have a positive impact on the world?
- 8. The angels came to the shepherds at night, when most people were sleeping. Most did not see or hear the angels—but the shepherds did. What is it in us that can see and receive the Lord—even when during times of great darkness?
- 9. After witnessing the miracle of the Lord's birth, the shepherds returned, "glorifying and praising God." What impact does seeing the Lord in our own lives have on us?
- 10. What is it to glorify and praise God?
- 11. Do we have a responsibility to share the Good News of the Lord's coming with others?

New Church Concepts Useful Service

Love and wisdom come into and remain in existence in service; and service consists in performing the tasks of one's calling faithfully, honestly and diligently. The love of service and thus diligence in service concentrates the mind and keeps it from wandering, and absorbing all the desires which pour in from the body and the world through the senses, causing the truths of religion and morality with the kinds of good they produce to be scattered to the four winds. But the earnest devotion of the mind to service keeps them together and binds them, disposing the mind so as to receive wisdom coming from those truths. Then it banishes to one side or the other the mockery and folly of falsities and vanities. See Marriage Love 16.3

When a person is performing a service, his mind has a circle drawn around it, within which it is by stages arranged to become a truly human form. From this it can see desires outside itself, and is brought by soundness of reason to banish them. The opposite is true for those who are idle. In their case the mind is unbounded and uncircumscribed, and so a person allows into it all the empty and absurd ideas emanating from the world and the body, and causes it to love them.
