Three Languages of the Word Triptych


This project is a replica of the triptych in the Benade Hall Chapel auditorium in Bryn Athyn.

Materials

red construction paper Hebrew, Greek and Latin arches glue (rubber cement is recommended) scissors

Construction

- 1. Fold two pieces of red construction paper in half.
- 2. Glue the two pieces of construction paper together (overlapping one side as shown in the diagram below). This will provide 3 equal sections and make the triptych sturdier. Note: You may glue the red panels to corrugated paper or wood and hinge the sections for additional strength and permanence.
- 3. Cut out each arch with lettering in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin. Glue the arches on the backing, with the Hebrew arch on the left, Latin in the middle, and Greek on the right (see diagram below).
 - The Hebrew lettering is the Ten Commandments found in Exodus 20: 1-7.
 - The Greek lettering is the Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6: 9-13.
 - The Latin words are the proclamation from *True Christian Religion* 791 "That the Lord God Jesus Christ reigns, whose Kingdom shall be for ever and ever."
