New Church Concept Vine and Branches

No one can do what is good from himself, but that he does it from the Lord: Jesus said, I am the true vine, and My Father is the vine-dresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes it, that it may bear more fruit. Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine, so neither can you except you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he that abides in Me, and I in him, the same bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. If a man does not abide in Me, he is cast forth into the fire, and burned (John 15:1-6). See Life 29

Vine, Grapes and Wine

Bring this lesson to life by sharing grapes or grape juice during the discussion.

- 1. What was Jesus' first miracle at the wedding in Cana? Hint: water pots.
- 2. What *drink* did Jesus offer His disciples at the Last Supper?
- 3. Which *food* did Jesus say He was in an "I Am" statement? (bread of life)
- 4. Which *food* and *drink* are offered during Holy Supper, the most holy act of worship? Why are these particular foods offered? Could other food or drink be offered instead?
- 5. Jesus' seventh and final "I Am" statement, "I am the true vine," is part of His farewell speech to the disciples. What is the relationship between the vine, the grapes and the wine? How might this "I Am" statement change the way the way the disciples thought about Jesus? Does it change the way you think about Jesus?

Watch The Vine and the Branches, John 15:1-27 from *The Life of Jesus*. English. Official Full HD Movie, at bit.ly/GCEDGospelOfJohn. (Enter link in the web browser bar at the top of your screen.) Start at 2hr 4min 53sec. End at 2hr 9min 15sec; 4min 22sec. This story takes place after the Last Supper. After giving a message of comfort and consolation in the first part of His farewell speech, Jesus calls the disciples to a full commitment to Him, and warns what will happen if they do not commit.

Note: You may find it helpful to have Bibles open to John 15 for the discussion.

- 1. What image does Jesus use to illustrate our complete dependence on Him?
- 2. Jesus speaks of pruning unfruitful branches. If vine branches were human, how would pruning take place? What pain might be associated with pruning?
- 3. How does our relationship with the Lord change when we practice His teachings? Are there other ways in which we can achieve the same result?
- 4. Describe a time when you felt like the Lord was your friend.
- 5. List the characteristics of someone who is friends with the Lord.
- 6. What makes the Lord happy? (John 15:11) How can we experience this joy?
- 7. What is "the world" in us that "hates" the Lord?
- 8. When might speaking truth and showing love lead to hostility from others?

New Church Concept Farewell Address

Selections from *The Gospel of John* by Rev. Dr. Ray Silverman,

The sequence of Jesus' farewell discourse amounts to this: Although Jesus assures His disciples that He will be with them in every way (part one), He lets them know that they should anticipate a severe struggle (part two).

The second part begins with Jesus' declaration that He is the "true vine." "I am the true vine," He says, "and My Father is the vinedresser" (15:1). This is the seventh and final "I Am" statement in the Gospel of John. As with His previous assertions ("I am the bread of life," "I am the resurrection and the life," and "I am the way, the truth, and the life"), it is another bold assertion of His Divinity. By calling Himself "the true vine," Jesus suggests that He is also "the tree of life"—the source of all goodness, and of all heavenly joy.

The only detail of the Passover supper is a brief comment that the bread is dipped in bitter herbs (13:26). In all the other gospels, Jesus offers His disciples the bread and wine, referring to the bread as His body and the wine as His blood. Additionally, in every case He refers to the wine as "the fruit of the vine." But in John, the main action takes place in the scene when Jesus washes His disciples' feet. There, instead of a detailed description of what happened after supper. This object lesson illustrates and emphasizes His new commandment: "Love one another, as I have loved you" (13:34). The focus is on service, not ceremony; on love, not liturgy.
