New Church Concepts Permissions

There are no "laws of permission" that are simply that, or that are separate from the laws of divine providence. They are the same thing; so saying that God allows something to happen does not mean that he wants it to happen but that he cannot prevent it because of his goal, which is our salvation. Whatever happens for the sake of our salvation is in accord with the laws of divine providence, since divine providence is always moving away from and contrary to our own intentions. It is constantly focused on its goal; so when it notices we are straying from that goal it leads us away from evil and toward good. This cannot be accomplished without allowing bad things to happen. Good or Bad?

An old Chinese Proverb goes like this...

Read

Good and bad things happen because God gives each person the freedom to choose between good and evil. If we are to choose good we must see our selfish thoughts and feelings for what they are. This would be impossible to do if we did not experience evil and its consequences. Through experiencing bad things we are able to

see our evils and reject them as sins against God.

Unless evils were allowed to break out, a person would not see them and therefore would not acknowledge them, and thus could not be induced to resist them. Evils cannot be repressed by any act of Providence; for it they were they would remain shut in, and like a disease, such as cancer they would spread and consume everything vital in the person. See *Divine Providence* 251

If the Lord did not allow evil things to happen He could not lead people away from evil and towards heaven. This may make it seem as if the Lord wants us to experience temptation, but the truth is that He does not tempt us. He is constantly looking at the good we can be led into by getting rid of evil actions and longings.

New Church Concept The Lord's Leading

The nature of the Lord's Providence is such that it is linked together with foresight: the one does not exist without the other. For evil things are foreseen, but good ones are provided; and the evils things that are foreseen are constantly being turned towards what is good. Nothing is allowed to happen except to the end that something good may come out of it. But because a person possesses freedom that enables him to be reformed, he is turned from evil towards good so far as he freely allows himself to be turned. See Arcana Coelestia 6489

There is no such thing as chance, that is, evil happening by chance, but all evils are controlled in a way that not a single one of them is permitted to happen to a person on earth or to a soul that does not lead to good. Furthermore, nothing is permitted to happen that has not been foreseen, for otherwise it cannot happen. Consequently, all evils are bent in such a way that just those, and not any others, do happen, because it cannot be helped in view of the corrupt state of humankind. See Spiritual Experiences 1088

Evils cannot be set aside unless they come to light. This does not mean that we have to act out our evils... but that we need to look carefully not only at our actions but also at our thoughts, at what we would do if it were not for our fear of the laws and of ill repute. We need to look especially at which evils we see as permissible in our spirit and do not regard as sins. *Divine Providence* 278
