Teacher Background Creation: Reflecting God through Correspondences A Key for Understanding the Word

There is a New Church teaching that, "The Word of God is like a body with a living soul" (*Arcana Coelestia* 1408). Many readers have sensed this deeper level of meaning within the words and images of the Bible.

God wrote His Word so that every image contains multiple levels of meaning. The literal meaning focuses on the natural, physical world. A deeper symbolic meaning focuses on the world of the spirit, the world of the human mind. The relationship between the two levels is called "correspondence". Natural images and symbols "correspond" to spiritual qualities.

We often make this connection between levels without thinking about it. For example, we may talk about not "muddying the waters", or say that a child is "testing the waters". When we say "not muddying the waters" we are not talking about water at all; we are saying that false or misleading ideas should not be brought into a situation. Similarly, a child "testing the waters" is experimenting with his or her behavior to see how others react. These sayings make connections between the way true ideas work in our minds with the way water works in the natural world.

Jesus made connections like this in His conversations with people. To a woman at Jacob's well, He said, "Whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life" (John 4:14). Jesus was associating the true spiritual ideas He came on earth to teach with water. The connection is in how they are useful—how they work in our lives. True ideas from the Word cleanse our thoughts just as water cleanses our bodies.

Sometimes these connections are harder to see in the stories of the Old Testament. The key, according to the Heavenly Doctrine for the New Church, is this concept of correspondences. Correspondences allow us to see more than the general allegory of the human journey to the "promised land" of heaven. They help us see who God is and what He intends for us in specific ways. A knowledge of correspondences can help us gain fresh insight into the stories of the Old Testament.

This is true for the creation story. The Heavenly Doctrine explains creation in terms of a person's step-by-step spiritual progress along the path to heaven. Each "day" of creation pictures a new level of personal development. The seventh day is a beautiful picture of the restful state of heaven—a state free from the struggles against selfishness that we all deal with in this world.

The spiritual meanings of the days of creation are interwoven throughout this lesson. We hope they bring this familiar story to life in new ways.

Correspondences are natural truths in which spiritual truths are reflected as in a mirror. *Arcana Coelestia* 9300



The Seventh Day Level C

Genesis 2:1-3

Ages 11-14

Life Focus: The Lord's Word and the created world reflect the Lord, the Creator.

Lesson Focus: The Lord's purpose for all creation is to bless us with life in heaven when we die.

Reading: Thus the heavens and the earth, and all the host of them, were finished. And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made (Genesis 2:1-3).

Welcome Warm-up Activity

How a Person Develops Video Activity

Choose a video showing a person developing from infancy to adulthood from the playlist at www.bitly.com/WondersOfCreation. Encourage questions and discussion as you watch. For example,

- 1. What can babies do at birth? (very little—nurse, cry, move limbs)
- 2. Stop the movie at different points and ask questions such as, "What has changed? What might he/she be able to do now? What might he/she be thinking about?"
- 3. Each step of development prepares for the next step. Our spiritual growth is similar to the way our bodies and minds grow. We first have to learn what is right and wrong, then practice it, and then finally know and love doing it.

Genesis 2:1-3

Talk About It

The Lord created the world gradually in stages or "days". What are the ordered stages of the first six "days" of creation? Giving light, separating the waters, land and plants, lights in the sky (sun, moon and stars), fish and birds, animals and people created in the Lord's image and likeness.

Human beings also develop gradually. A person is born as a baby, knowing nothing, and slowly learns to crawl, walk, talk, and explore the world. Why is this gradual development important? How would life be different if we were born as adults?

Just as the world was created slowly, and we develop slowly, we are *re*-created for heaven one step at a time. The work the Lord did on the first six days of creation is like the work we do to get ready for heaven. What is our work? Try to do what the Word tells us, be loving to other people, etc.

What happened on the seventh day? God finished His work and rested.

The Lord set aside a day of rest each week. Why is rest important? What can happen if we do not get rest?

The Ten Commandments tell us to "remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy." "Sabbath" means rest or peace. God blessed the seventh day and "sanctified" it. "Sanctified" means made holy, or set apart. How is Sunday different from other days?

When the Lord was in the world He taught in the temple, healed, and fed people on the Sabbath. He showed that the Sabbath is a day for serving others as well as remembering the Lord. What might you do to serve others on the Sabbath?

The Lord blessed the seventh day. Blessing means to make happy. The Lord gives us true and loving ideas that show us how to live lives that lead to the happiness of heaven. Doing what the Word teaches opens our hearts to the Lord and leads to heavenly rest, free from the selfish struggles of earthly life.

3. Learn by Doing


Choose one or two activities



Creation Scherenschnitte

Scherenschnitte means "paper cuts" in German. In this activity, students work together to create a display of Scherenschnitte designs of the seven days of creation. If possible, put the display up somewhere the whole congregation will be able to enjoy it.

- With the seventh day, we have completed our study of creation. To celebrate, we are
 - going to create a display depicting the seven days. We will be using a design technique known as paper cutting or Scherenschnitte.



- 3. As student fold the designs and begin cutting, double check that each student is working on the correct design. If the wrong areas are accidentally cut, you can tape them back together.
- 4. When the designs are completed, arrange the pieces in a tasteful way (ideally, with the days of creation in order) and tack or tape them in place.
- 5. As a group, stand back and enjoy the art you have created! Take time to look carefully at each design and list all the shapes you see. Note that both the positive and negative spaces may be showing you details of things the Lord created on each day.



choice Seven Steps to Heaven

The seventh day represents the last step in the journey of becoming a heavenly or celestial person. The self-discipline of trying to obey the Lord is replaced by a willing attitude of doing what the Lord asks simply because a person loves and wants to do it.

In this activity, students will review the days of creation and the steps it takes to reach the goal of becoming a heavenly person. They will be asked to summarize each step in a few words to help them remember it.

Materials Needed

4-5 copies each of pp. 7-8 printed onto different colors of paper if possible, 1-2 copies of pp.9-10, good quality scissors, bulletin board or wall area for display, thumb tacks or tape

Prepare in Advance

Depending on the size of your class, you may wish to cut out the letters beforehand.

Activity Hint!

Some of the designs are simpler to cut than others. Help students choose designs they can cut out successfully. The words can be loosely cut around rather than cutting out each individual letter.

- 1. The seventh day or creation pictures the final heavenly state people reach after faithfully learning what is true and practicing it daily. Resting on the seventh day is not rest from work, but rest from the worry and struggle that come from trying to do what is right when part of us does not want to do it.
- 2. We will be taking a look at all the steps that must happen in a person's life to reach this final stage of blessing and peace.
- 3. Divide the class into small groups or have students work individually.
- 4. Distribute one *Seven Steps to Heaven* question (from p. 11) to each group or individual, along with the information for that step (from pp. 12-15). If students work fast, or you would like to do this activity as a group, give students more than one question or simply do the activity together.
- 5. Allow 5 minutes to read the questions and information and discuss.
- 6. Gather students together to share their answers. Share in order of the days of creation.
- 7. Once groups have shared, try to identify one or two words for each step that sum up what a person needs to do to prepare for heaven.
- 8. What do you think is the is the most important quality a person should develop to prepare for heaven?

New Church Concept Stages of Rebirth

Regeneration takes place in a manner analogous to that in which a person is conceived, carried in the womb, born and educated.... Having a concept of sin and then looking for sin in ourselves is the beginning of repentance.... We are to repent actively. That is, we are to examine ourselves, recognize and admit our sins, pray to the Lord, and begin a new life. The Lord is constantly active in regenerating and saving us. When we have been regenerated we have a new will and a new intellect and will be in fellowship with the angels of heaven (see True Christianity 586, 511, 530, 577, 601, 607).

4. Wrap It Up

Closing

In what ways is the created world a reflection of God? (The stages of human development are mirrored in all of creation. Since people are created in the Lord's image, creation is a mirror of God and all that He is and does.)


Why does the Lord want you to go to heaven? (So He can give you the greatest happiness possible.)

The Lord wants to lead you to heaven where you will have happiness and peace. What can you do each day to follow the Lord on the way to heaven?





Seven Steps to Heaven Questions

1

The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night (Genesis 1:2-5).

We are born into darkness—"without form and void". We do not know anything. On the "first day" we begin to take in the world around us. Our minds begin to form ideas. Light dawns.

To enter heaven we must be born again. This spiritual birth (or re-birth) takes place when a person is an adult. It starts when a person allows true ideas from the Word to shine into his or her mind and light up the way to heaven.

Just as natural light helps us see our way in the world, heavenly light from the Word leads us to heaven.

2

Then God said, "Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters." Thus God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament; and it was so. And God called the firmament heaven (Genesis 1:6-8).

Our bodies contain more water than anything else—we cannot exist without it! Our need for water corresponds to our spiritual need for true ideas from the Word.

True ideas are as important for our minds as water is for our bodies. Without them we would not know right and wrong—and without this we cannot know the path to heaven.

Different kinds of water picture different ways true ideas come to us. Ideas about the world—e.g. gravity—come from personal experience and scientific discovery. True ideas about the natural world correspond to the waters below. Heavenly ideas from the Word correspond to the waters above.

We can connect our lives with heaven when we know what the Word teaches and use our practical knowledge and skills to serve the Lord and the neighbor.

3

Then God said, "Let the waters under the heavens be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear"; and it was so. And God called the dry land Earth, and the gathering together of the waters He called Seas.... Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb that yields seed, and the fruit tree that yields fruit according to its kind, whose seed is in itself, on the earth"; and it was so. And the earth brought forth grass, the herb that yields seed...and the tree that yields fruit, whose seed is...according to its kind (Genesis 1:9-12).

The waters (true ideas) were "gathered" into seas, so land (love for heavenly things) could appear.

The first living things created were plants. They are a source of food for all living things.

Land provides resources like stone, metal, wood, fuel, and gemstones. It gives us a place to build homes and grow food.

A person's mind is sometimes compared with a garden. True ideas from the Word correspond to seeds. These "seeds" of truth receive light, warmth and water from the Word when we read the Word and want to change our lives by doing what it teaches.

Jesus said that if we do what He teaches we will "bear much fruit" (John 15:5). Our fruits are the useful services we do for others—comforting a friend who is sad, helping out with chores, etc.

4

Then God said, "Let there be lights in the firmament of the heavens to divide the day from the night...and let them be for lights in the firmament of the heavens to give light on the earth"; and it was so. Then God made two great lights: the greater light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night. He made the stars also. God set them in the firmament of the heavens to give light on the earth, and to rule over the day and over the night, and to divide the light from the darkness (Genesis 1:14-17).

Without the sun's light and heat, earth would be so cold that no living things could exist. The Lord's great love for us is like the warmth of the sun. His wisdom is the light by which we see the path to heaven. He communicates both of these to us in His Word. In heaven the Lord's love and wisdom form the heavenly sun, which gives the angels warmth and light.

We receive the Lord's love in greater measure when we turn to Him—just as the earth warms as it turns toward the sun. We especially receive and experience the Lord's love when we do what He teaches.

We see the moon when it is dark. It is light because sunlight reflects from its surface. The moon symbolizes how the Lord is with us during dark times through our faith. We see Him reflected in true ideas we know, even when the warmth of His love feels far away. This lesser light guides us until we feel the warmth of the Lord's love again.

5

Then God said, "Let the waters abound with an abundance of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the face of the firmament of the heavens." So God created great sea creatures and every living thing that moves, with which the waters abounded, according to their kind, and every winged bird according to its kind.... And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth" (Genesis 1:20-22).

Fish correspond to basic facts living in "water"—practical knowledge of right and wrong, and scientific ideas.

Many disciples were fishermen. They caught fish in deep water and brought them out into the air. Jesus called His disciples "fishers of men" because they taught people true ideas from the Word that could lead them upwards, to heaven.

Birds correspond to thoughts. Some thoughts are higher than others. Eagles nest high up in trees and can soar high in the sky, seeing far and wide. Other birds nest and spend most of the day on the ground.

The variety of fish and birds reflects the way each human being and each thought is unique. The variety also shows us how infinite (limitless) the Lord is.

6

And God made the beast of the earth according to its kind, cattle according to its kind, and everything that creeps on the earth according to its kind.... So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him: male and female He created them. Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth." And God said, "See, I have given you every herb that yields seed which is on the face of all the earth, and every tree whose fruit yields seed; to you it shall be for food" (Genesis 1:25-29).

Animals are concerned with physical and worldly desires—food, safety, etc. They spend their time eating, protecting their babies, and interacting with other animals.

Humans are the only created beings that can know respond to the Lord. Nothing else in creation does—which is why only human beings live to eternity. People become more like animals if they do not make the Lord and spiritual things most important in their lives.

The Lord wants every person to go to heaven, but He never forces us to do what will make us truly and eternally happy. He creates us so we can freely choose to return His love. In returning His love we become fully human, in His image and likeness.
