

Ten Commandments

Level B

Ages 7-10

Exodus 19:1-20; 20:1-17 - selections

Series Theme: The Lord leads and provides for us, and we can choose to follow Him.

Lesson Focus: The Lord teaches us what we should do.

Reading Summary: The children of Israel went into the Wilderness of Sinai. The Lord called to Moses from the mountain and said, "If you obey My voice and keep My covenant you shall be a special treasure to Me." The people answered, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do." Moses sanctified the people and told them not to come near the mountain. On the third day there were thunderings and lightnings and a loud trumpet. The people stood at the foot of the mountain. Mount Sinai was covered in thick smoke, and the whole mountain quaked. The Lord came down on the top of the mountain, and Moses went up. The Lord said: "I am the Lord your God, you shall have no other gods before Me. You shall not take the Lord's name in vain. Remember the Sabbath day. Honor your father and mother. Do not commit murder. Do not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife nor anything that is your neighbor's."

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1. Welcome Warm-up Activity

Ten Commandments Song

Supplies needed: internet access, equipment to show video of song

Seat children on the floor. Today we will be learning a song about the Ten Commandments. Play song at https://www.newchurchvineyard.org/resource/video-the-ten-commandments-song/. After listening several times, invite the children to sing along. As they gain confidence, encourage everyone to sing without the help of the video. Sheet music with the words is on p. 8.

Challenge: Divide the class into two groups. See if the children can alternate singing the commandments. Group one sings: You shall have no other gods before Me. Group two sings: You shall not take the Lord's name in vain, etc.

2. Focus on the Word

Read: Selections from Exodus 19:1-20; 20:1-17 on p. 5. See teaching pictures on pp. 6-7.

What kinds of rules do you have in your house? Who chooses the rules? What happens if rules are broken?

Rules are important. What would happen if there were no rules? People would not know what was right and what was wrong. People would probably do what they wanted, or what felt good to them, but they would not know how to get to heaven. Rules help us in so many ways.

When the children of Israel left Egypt they also left behind the rules of Egypt. They needed new rules because they were becoming a new nation. The Lord brought the children of Israel through the wilderness to Mount Sinai where He gave them new rules. What were the rules called? The Ten Commandments

What happened on the mountain as the Lord prepared to give the children of Israel the Ten Commandments? There were thunderings and lightenings, and the sound of a loud trumpet. These sights and sounds showed that something very important was happening.

What happened next? The Lord came down on the mountain, and Moses went up. The Lord gave Moses the Ten Commandments.

The commandments are rules that the children of Israel were to obey. They are rules for us as well and they tell us what we should do and what we should not do. When we go to the Word to find out how we are to act, it is like going "up on the mountain". The Lord's power in our lives is like the loud thunder and brilliant light of truth in our minds.

The Ten Commandments were carved on two tablets of stone. They were the most precious thing that the children of Israel had. (Show teaching pictures on pp. 6-7.) They were kept in the Ark of the Covenant.

Which of the commandments can you remember? Encourage children to say any command-ments they can remember. (See list on p. 5). Don't worry about remembering all ten.

What did the people say as they were getting ready to receive the commandments? All that the Lord has spoken we will do.

The Lord also wants us to do what the Ten Commandments tell us to. The Lord made a covenant or agreement with the children of Israel. If they obeyed the commandments, they would be His people. He offers us the same covenant. If we do what He teaches, He will lead us to heaven.



3. Learn by Doing

Choose one or two activities



10 Commandments Mobile

The Writings for the New Church tell us that in heaven the Lord appears to people in the sun, which represents His great love for all people. In this project, children create a mobile showing the Lord in the spiritual sun and themselves on earth, connected by the Ten Commandments in a paper chain.

- 1. Did you know that obeying the commandments connects us with the Lord? They form a kind of link between earth and heaven. They teach us how to live, so learning them and trying to follow them is one of the most important things we can do.
- 2. Hand a copy of *Heaven—Commandments Mobile* (p. 9) to each student. Cut out the circle around the Lord, not quite cutting the two circles apart if possible.
- 3. Carefully cut apart the strips with the commandments written on them. Tape the first commandment into a tear drop shape. Then tape the two ends near the bottom of the back of one of the circles with the Lord. Fold the circles back to back and tape together.
- Tape two ends of a piece of ribbon, yarn or string to the back of the top of one of the circles with the Lord. Fold the two circles over back to back and tape them together.
- 5. Put the second commandment strip through the first and tape it together into a circle. Do this process with commandments 3-8, making them into a chain. Do the same with the 9-10 commandment strip, only make that one into a tear drop shape like the first one.
- 6. Put out copies of *Earth—Commandments Mobile* (pp. 10-11). Children will each choose a figure to use to represent themselves on earth. Cut out the circles, not quite cutting them apart if possible. Tape the end of the 10th commandment to the back of one of the circles. Fold the circles back to back and tape them together to complete the mobile.



Choice > Hebrew Commandments

The Ten Commandments are in the Old Testament, which is written in Hebrew. The Writings tell us that the Hebrew language is similar to the language of the ancients. It also resembles the way the Word is written in heaven (De Verbo 4). Each letter has a special meaning so that angels reading the Word get meaning from each letter. Hebrew is also like the language angels speak (*Heaven and Hell* 237). This activity introduces part of each of the Ten Commandments in Hebrew. A video is provided so ~



- 1. People all over the world speak in different languages. How many languages can you name?
- 2. In what languages is the Word written? (Old Testament: Hebrew; New Testament: Greek; Writings for the New Church: Latin)
- 3. The Ten Commandments are in the Old Testament. In what language were they written? (Hebrew)
- 4. Hand out *Ten Commandments in Hebrew*, p. 12. Languages can be written in different directions. English is written from left to right; Hebrew is written from the right to left.
- 5. We will trace over or color in the Hebrew letters of the Ten Commandments to find out what it is like to write in Hebrew. Start on the right hand side of the First Table. Start at the top of the page on the right, go across the page to the left and then down each page.
- 6. While we are working we will listen to the Ten Commandments being read in Hebrew.

4. Wrap It Up

Memory Verse

Read the following verse aloud one phrase at a time. Have the children repeat it after you. Then, when you have said it together several times, challenge the children to say it on their own.

He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me.

Closing

The Lord invites each of us to enter into a covenant with Him. We do this by learning the Ten Commandments and doing them each day.

The Ten Commandments Readings

Exodus 19:1-3,5,7-8,14-20; 20:1-17 - selections

To shorten readings, read only the bold text.

In the third month after the children of Israel had gone out of the land of Egypt they came to the Wilderness of Sinai. So Israel camped there before the mountain.

And Moses went up to God, and the Lord called to him from the mountain, saying..., "If you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be a special treasure to Me." So Moses called for the elders of the people, and laid before them all these words which the Lord commanded him. Then all the people answered together, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do."

So Moses went down from the mountain to the people and sanctified the people, and they washed their clothes. And he said to the people, "Be ready for the third day."

Then it came to pass on the third day, in the morning, that there were thunderings and lightnings, and a thick cloud on the mountain; and the sound of the trumpet was very loud, so that all the people who were in the camp trembled. And Moses brought the people out of the camp to meet with God, and they stood at the foot of the mountain.

Now Mount Sinai was completely in smoke, because the Lord descended upon it in fire. And the whole mountain quaked greatly. And when the blast of the trumpet sounded long and became louder and louder, Moses spoke, and God answered him by voice.


Then the Lord came down upon Mount Sinai, on the top of the mountain. And the Lord called Moses to the top of the mountain, and Moses went up.


